STRIKES

Strikes result in only about 10% of contract negotiations. The employees make the final decision about going on strike.

When a union does strike, employees usually picket their place of employment.

When a company hires non-union workers to replace the unionized workers during a strike, the replacements are sometimes called scabs.

Union members vote to strike or to end a strike at the local union level.

Sometimes a strike is ended when management gets an injunction or a court order to end the strike.
